

## **Mapping 2008 Eastern Burma Caseloads of Border Based Health Services Providers**

These maps and charts depict the number of cases treated for each main disease per target population in each township. This data highlights the extent of service provision in each area relative to the size of the population. The “official” population figures are from the Myanmar Ministry of Health 2007. HISWG does not provide an opinion on the accuracy of these total population figures but has included them in the absence of more current information. Most of the target populations are in relatively stable rural areas of Eastern Burma.

These graphs do not depict disease prevalence or incidence rates, nor do they represent the general morbidity conditions among the entire population of the region. Such indicators cannot be calculated with the data included as the caseloads do not include cases that did not see a health worker for treatment and because the data is not population based.

When interpreting these figures, it is important to note that the caseload treated per population depends on the underlying morbidity rate; certain diseases, such as malaria, are less prevalent in certain regions, and thus, the caseload per target population will be lower. Thus, a low caseload per target population could either be because service coverage was low or because the prevalence of the disease was low. Similarly, a high caseload per population does not necessarily indicate comprehensive service coverage; if the disease is very prevalent, it is possible that not all cases were treated.

# Eastern Burma Malaria Caseloads per Target Population 2008 By Border Based Health Service Providers













